### Annual Report on the Pupil Premium Funding 2024-25

#### Pupil Premium Allocation

<b>Total Number of Pupils on Roll (October 2023)</b>	330
<b>Number of Pupils eligible for Pupil Premium (October 2023 Census)</b>	94
<b>Total Amount of Pupil Premium Received (2024-2025)</b>	£146,988

Pupil Premium funding comes directly into schools and is based on the number of children registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at that moment and in the past six years. It is also given for any Looked After or Service children.

It should be noted that not all children eligible for FSM are low attaining or making poor progress. We had to consider how to support the learning of some high attaining children in addition to those who have barriers to learning.

Staff salaries including the employment of a nurture TA	All	£151.828	<p>Our Teaching Assistants are vital in supporting teaching and learning. TAs support the teacher in helping all children reach their potential and make progress.</p> <p>EEF findings show that the average impact of the deployment of teaching assistants is about an additional four months progress across a year. The research suggests that TA support is more effective when the TAs deliver targeted interventions to individual pupils and small groups as opposed to general classroom support.</p> <p>Therefore, as a school we have decided to invest time and money into training TAs in order to effectively lead focused interventions 1:1 and in small groups to support our disadvantaged pupils to make accelerated progress and begin to close the gap.</p>
Breakfast Club	All	£1109	Ensures that all children have the opportunity to have a nutritious breakfast each morning which is vital.
Reading resources contribution including RWI Online	All	£122	<p>This ensures that strong foundations are set in the Early Years and KS1 to support children's development in reading. This comprehensive approach also supplies additional intervention to support all children in making good progress in phonics.</p> <p>Furthermore, resources such as Barrington Stoke books continue to support our older readers in making good progress in reading fluency and comprehension. New and updated books also have an impact, as this helps foster a love of reading in all children and supports the good development of comprehension.</p>

Maths resources including Can Do Maths	All	£277	<p>These resources are beginning to help raise standards in Maths lessons and across the board in the Maths curriculum. This is as a result of a more comprehensive and consistent approach to our Maths curriculum. Smaller steps and more focused resources help all children access the learning in Maths lessons and support them to make at least good progress. Furthermore, focused interventions allow children to fill gaps in their mathematical knowledge and make accelerated progress</p> <p>Furthermore, the Maths intervention Number Stacks is supporting specific pupils in filling gaps in their mathematical knowledge to ensure that lessons build upon each other and that the foundations of mathematical knowledge is in place to support children's new learning in lessons.</p>
IT Resources Including My Concern	All	£400.00	<p>This investment has ensured that we can provide an effective computing curriculum and also provides children with more opportunities to use educational apps such as Spelling Shed, Times Tables Rock Stars and Accelerated Reader within school, so that being unable to access these resources at home does not become a barrier. Furthermore, Class Dojo is also being used to develop communication between home and school.</p>
Contribution towards curriculum resources	All	£59	<p>These resources ensure all children can access high quality lessons which are part of a well-resourced and progressive curriculum. These resources are not always physical items but are also enrichment activities which require specialists in certain areas to visit school and lead sessions.</p>
Contribution towards trips	Pupil Premium Children	£811	<p>This provides our Pupil Premium children with an opportunity to access activities and experiences which they may not be able to experience otherwise and supports the learning in school.</p>
